- IMPORTANT NOTICE - KHC WALK-IN PATIENTS


(Effective September 12, 2016)

WHY NATIVE AMERICAN DAY IS CELEBRATED

Native American Day is officially observed by the Gila River Indian Community (GRIC) on Friday, September 16th, 2016.

Native Americans are considered to be the first Americans to live in and populate the United States.

The first American Indian Day in a state was declared by the governor of New York on the second Saturday in May 1916. Following New York, several states celebrated the fourth Friday in September. While the day was recognized by some states, during this period, the day was not recognized as a national, legal holiday.

It wasn't until 1968, when Governor Ronald Reagan signed a resolution establishing a holiday called "American Indian Day," to be held the fourth Friday in September.

Gila River Health Care takes the opportunity to educate employees while commemorating and celebrating Native American culture.
